Topic: Coal Mining Industry

Lesson 21: The Iowa Coal Mine

Objectives:

- 1. Students will become aware of the major methods for coal extraction.
- 2. Students will compare coal mining methods of ihe late 1800s and early 1900s with methods of today.

Materials:

Transparency: Iowa County Map (see Lesson 2) Student access to *Coal Mining in Iowa* Student access to *A Tour Through an A Ibia Coal Company Mine* Resources for researching coal mining

Activiities:

- 1. Distribute copies of *Coal Mining in Iowa*. Read the section under the question, "What was it like inside a coal mine?" Emphasize the distinction between the four main methods of extracting coal and the advantages of each.
- 2. Provide students with access to *A Tour Through An Albia Coal Company Mine*. Introduce the pamphlet as a recounting of a tour for a history of Monroe County in 1878. Using the transparency of Iowa counties, locate Monroe County.
- 3. Read and discuss the account of the tour. Compare the description of the mine with figure 2, emphasizing the structure of the room-and-pillar mine.
- 4. As a follow-up to this discussion, suggest the following questions for independent research:
 - a. What coal mining operations currently are going on in the state? Other minerals?
 - b. How did the methods of coal mining a hundred years ago compare with methods today? How are tools different today?
 - c. What effect has mining had on the environment in the past? What is being done today?
- 5. Provide time for students to share the results of their research.
